Hello Night & Opening Mass

Learning Conversations - 9th and 18th of March

Learning Conversations are an opportunity for students and parents/carers to chat with the classroom teachers about their child's learning goals and progress. If your child is to have a PSG meeting instead - you will have received a letter explaining this and you do not need to have a Learning Conversation as well. If you are unsure - please just ask either the classroom teacher or Jenny Kerrins.

We ask that all families parking in the car park use the crossing in the middle of the car park to cross over to the other side. We have seen several children copy their parents and run across in an unsafe way.

Attendance

We are having a really big push on attendance - please help us out by getting the kids to bed at a reasonable hour (we have seen the following recommendations: 7pm for Preps, 7.30pm for Yr 1-3, 8pm for Yr 4 and 8.30pm for Yr 5 & 6). Ideally the students would arrive at school between 8.30am and 8.45am - allowing enough time to put bags away and grab some breaky or have a play before walking begins at 8.55am. We are aiming for every child to be at school every day - unless they are unwell. Birthdays or trips or tiredness are not reasons for being away. Every child - Every day.

Playing at school after hours

Some students have been returning to school in the afternoon for a play. We ask that all children have been home first - so parents know where they are going. Parents need to be aware that if/when students return to have a play after school hours - they are not supervised by school staff. Please consider this when deciding whether or not you allow your child to return.

Riding a Bike or Scooter to school.

All students who ride a bike or scooter to school are required to wear a helmet - and it must be done up properly. This is a Victorian law and not a school rule. Students need to be safe and avoid a fine by wearing a helmet.

Middle and Senior Swimming Programs

The 3/4 and 5/6 Swimming Programs continue this week. Again they will be swimming Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday

3/4s will be swimming 12.50pm to 1.30pm. 5/6s will be swimming 1.30pm to 2.10pm.

HOW TO APPLY

Children must be aged 4 to 18 and named on a valid Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card and Medicare card to be eligible. Find out if you can apply, what costs are covered and how much can be reimbursed.

Something to Think About

Where do you need God today? Is there an area of your life that has taken over your mind? Persevering is hard to do but God doesn't give you anything you can't handle. Offer it up to God today and let it be something you get through together.

The Story

A listening heart is a heart warmed by the love of God, and taught by his words. The one we listen to is the Son of God, Jesus transfigured in his humanity. Prayer is better described as listening than speaking. Spend some time echoing his words, or just listening to the mood of love and peace in prayer. Following Jesus up the mountain for Peter, James and John was a following in love which would be part of their lives in the future. Going up the mountain had its tough moments for the apostles, but the view at the top was worthwhile: the glory of Jesus and the invitation of God. This is the same for us in our discipleship.

The Scriptures Mark 9:2-11

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what this rising from the dead could mean.
