

Something to Think About

In what ways does the image of 'good shepherd' resonate with me? In what ways do I struggle with this image? Recall times in life when you have been 'shepherded.' Have I ever seen myself as a shepherd?

Have I been called to give my life for another? In what ways have I given my life for others? 'Men and women for others.' How do I understand this statement of Jesus that he gave his life for me, for us, for the world? Out of love!


The Story

Jesus presents himself as the good shepherd who knows his sheep, cares for them and lays down his life for them. He contrasts himself to hirelings (the Pharisees). He emphasises that he lays down his life, himself. No one takes his life from him. The sign of this will be his power to take up his life after he has laid it down.

This theme runs through the Passion narrative in John's Gospel and is a sign of his divinity. In a passage that is not in the Lectionary, we learn that the crowd once again is divided in its response to his words. It is worthwhile to reflect on your own reaction as a member of the crowd.

The Scriptures John 10:11-18

'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'
