

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Story

In this dramatic episode Mark is warning us that we are moving into a new depth of discipleship. The hostility of Jesus' enemies grows more intense, and will play itself out in his passion and death, when all of the disciples deserted him and fled (Mark 14:50). I beg that my faith in him will keep me close to him in the storms that threaten to swamp not only me but the Church, the world, and nature itself.





The Scriptures

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 4:35-41

On that day, when evening had come, Jesus said to the disciples, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"


Something to Think About

In the storms of my own life, I too can cry out "Lord, do you not care?".

He will hear me, reassure me and say "why are you afraid?

I am here with you."

The little phrase, 'Let us go over to the other side' has strategic importance for Mark, and for my training as a disciple. I am delighted to accept Jesus' invitation to board the boat, and all goes well for a while. But then the crossing proves difficult, indeed it almost claims the lives of the little group. In fact were it not for Jesus' presence, all would be lost. Let me be the one who has the presence of mind to wake him up and scream a warning into his ear. Let me watch in astonishment as he saves the day with a word.

The city's parks and gardens offer great playgrounds, barbecue facilities and stunning surrounds for tree hugging, cloud gazing, a kick of the footy or simply a chance to kick off shoes. Again Rosalind Park ticks plenty of boxes for letting the kids run free, as does the Bendigo Botanic

Gardens which includes the Garden of the Future. Give your kids a taste of gold fever at the historic Victoria Hill Mining Reserve, then challenge them to climb the Rosalind Park Poppet Head. While in the centre of the city, check out the Bendigo Art Gallery's children's program. There's often free activities for young culture vultures, especially during the school holidays.




