
Murtagh Family Literacy Award - Bob Hopley Murtagh Family Numeracy Award - Imogen Jones-Jack

Please look after everyone in the St Peter's community over the holidays and return them all safely next year.


Thank you for our Year 6s. Bless them as they head into secondary school. May they always remember their years at St Peter's with fondness.

We continue to hear about John the Baptist and our role to spread the message. As Christians, whether lay persons, religious or priests we are called to bring people face to face with Jesus and also to a conversion that brings a real joy and happiness into their lives.



# The Scriptures A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 3:10-18

And the crowds asked John the Baptist, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none: and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages." As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

# SUN 12

## Gaudete Sunday

Light the pink Advent candle. This candle is a symbol of joy because we are at the midpoint of Advent. Pray about things that make you joyful and the ways you bring joy to others. Today at Mass, notice that the priest will be wearing pink vestments!

## **MON 13**

Read Matthew 2:1–12 as a family and learn about the Magi who followed the star to find Jesus after his birth. Go outside with your family tonight and do some stargazing. Pray about the beautiful world that God has created for us.

#### **TUE 14**

Gather together for a meal and begin with a blessing. Make a plan to donate a meal to a person or family in need in your community.

## WED 15

Gather as a family around the Christmas tree or the Advent wreath and pray a prayer of blessing.

### THUR 16

As you prepare for Jesus' coming, plan a day and time for family members to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

# FRI 17

O Wisdom of our God Most High!
Today begins the O Antiphons. These are special prayers as the birth of
Jesus draws closer. Pray to God about areas of your life where you need the gift of wisdom to grow.

### SAT 18

O Leader of the House of Israel!
Pray for help to follow Jesus'
leadership. Demonstrate good
