If contact cannot be made with the parent, the emergency contact/s will be contacted to ensure the safety of the student







Parking Services

City of Greater Bendigo

Parking Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community.

The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school.

Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such



as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.



Bendigo Health Dental Services Kindergarten & ELC-based oral health service

In 2022, Dental Services continue to offer free screening, fluoride varnish and oral health promotion to local schools and early learning environments.

As a public health service, we are particularly interested in preventative health and believe working in early-years environments is an important step in minimising the impact of oral disease in our community.

What do we want to achieve?

- Early detection of oral health conditions (e.g. signs of tooth decay or gum disease, and other issues of concern).
- To provide children with relevant information about ways to look after their teeth and mouth.
- Encourage children to engage in health-promoting behaviours, as establishing good habits from an early age promotes positive lifetime habits and can prevent poor oral health.
- Prevent tooth decay through application of fluoride varnish to children's teeth.
- Offer a fun, happy experience in a familiar environment.

The outreach dental team

The dental team includes qualified oral health therapists, dental assistants, and oral health educators. All dental staff have 'Working with Children Checks'.

Before the visit

- Kindergartens/ELCs will distribute a consent form, which will be provided by Dental Services.
- Dental Services will collect completed forms two weeks prior to their visit, via email or physical collection.

What will happen when the outreach dental team visit?

- After introducing themselves and checking in with staff, the team will set up their portable equipment in a vacant space pre-determined by your centre.
- Our team will either talk to the entire group, or speak with small groups of children, about looking after their mouth and teeth.
- Individual children will sit in a portable dental chair and the oral health therapist will look in their mouth with a sterile mouth mirror and light. It will take approximately 3 minutes.
- Many children will have fluoride varnish applied to their teeth, and it is recommended that they do not eat or drink for 30 minutes afterwards.

After the visit

• Following the screen, we will post a brief report to the child's home address. We will also outline pathways to access public dental services.

The oral health screening visit does not replace a full examination at a dental surgery, but it is a good way to check for any early signs of dental disease.
