# **Early Childhood Early Intervention**

Early Childhood Early Intervention (ECEI) assists children aged 0-6 years who have a developmental delay or disability, and their families/carers. ECEI Initial Supports will support children and their families to develop the skills they need to take part in daily activities and achieve the best possible outcomes throughout their life.

### How does it work?

As an Early Childhood Partner, Intereach will provide families with information about the supports and services available in their local community to help their child achieve their goals. The type of support provided is about what is best for the child and family. This might include:

- Information and linkages to help the family access supports and services available in their local community;
- Short-term early intervention supports if this is the best way to support the child;
- Building the family's capacity and confidence to support their child; and
- Where the child may require longer term early childhood intervention supports, help to request access to the NDIS (the scheme).

Once a child has access to the scheme, the ECEI Coordinator will work with the family to develop a plan that supports the child's goals, explain the plan and support the family to link with their choice of providers.

### Is there a cost?

There is no cost to access Early Childhood Early Intervention.

### Where is it available?

Local Area Coordination is available across our Murrumbidgee, Mallee, Loddon and Goulburn regions.
