






Something to Think About

Knowing Jesus and having a good relationship with him is at the heart of our faith. This is more than information, which is knowing about Jesus and what he taught and did. Some people felt they were privileged and had the inside track as Jesus was one of them but Jesus was indicating something more than that. His way was open to all people of good will. Lord help us know you better, to more in tune with your message, so that we may live as your friends and companions.

The Story

Jesus warns us off any false sense of entitlement: like the Jews, we too can feel too comfortable in the belief that God is somehow obliged to save us. What counts is not our past exploits or successes, but being with the Master at all times. I ask for humility and inner freedom.

The Scriptures Luke 13:22-30

Jesus went through one town and village after another, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, 'Lord, will only a few be saved?' He said to them, 'Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able. When once the owner of the house has got up and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, "Lord, open to us", then in reply he will say to you, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will begin to say, "We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets." But he will say, "I do not know where you come from; go away from me, all you evildoers!" There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrown out. Then people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will eat in the kingdom of God. Indeed, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.'

WHITE CHOCOLATE AND RASPBFRRY MUFFINS

Ingredients:

3 cups Self-raising flour

3/4 cup caster sugar

2 eggs, lightly beaten

1 ½ cups milk

170g melted butter

½ cup white choc chips

½ cup fresh or frozen raspberries



Method:

Preheat the oven to 200'C.

Sift flour into a mixing bowl and stir in sugar.

Whisk together eggs, milk and butter and then add to flour and sugar.

Mix until just combined.

Fold in the chocolate chips and raspberries.

(Do not over-mix).

Spoon the mixture into buttered muffin trays or muffin papers.

while warm or leave to cool on a cooling rack. Ice when cool with the Best Ever Frosting!

Beat 250g softened cream cheese and 60g softened butter until light and creamy. Add 1 cup of icing sugar and 1 ½ tablespoons of lemon juice. Beat well until smooth and add to top of cooled muffins.
