The Scriptures

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 14:25-33

Now large crowds were travelling with him; and he turned and said to them, 'Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost. to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

What is Biodiversity and why is it important?

Biodiversity is the variety of biological beings that exist/live in the world. It includes all species, animals, plants, fungi and microorganisms, and their different characteristics.

The more variety that exists with living beings, the more the world is able to adapt to change, stay balanced and support life. Without biodiversity the world wouldn't be able to sustain itself.

How Can We Help With Biodiversity at Home?

Create a natural habitat in your backyard with native plants to attract local birds and wildlife.

- Take action on weeds know what's a weed and get rid of them.
- Be a responsible pet owner keep Cats indoors/ enclosed and keep Dogs on leads when walking in natural areas.
- Reduce, reuse and recycle check it before you chuck it!
- Start your own compost bin or worm farm for food waste if you have space.
- Be careful about what you put down your drains oils and chemicals can end up in our waterways and seas which can harm animals and plants. Try using white vinegar and bicarbonate of soda instead of commercial chemicals.
- Be an informed seafood eater learn what species are threatened and only buy seafood that is sustainably caught or farmed.
