Today, as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension of Jesus, I am invited to reflect on this event. What does it mean for me? Perhaps, like some of the disciples in today's Gospel, I am doubtful. I talk to Jesus very honestly about my doubts, knowing he will understand. I notice that he gives the same mission to those who believe and those who doubt.

I am invited to think further:

What do I do to make the love of God present and real to those I meet?

The Story I note Jesus' final words: "I am with you always." I hear these words now addressed to me: "I am with you always, I am with you at this moment, no matter what is going on in your life right now. I am with you."


The Scriptures ~ Matthew 28:16-20

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. What's happening

The Junior Unit



In the Junior Unit we have been focusing on counting during our daily numeracy sessions.

In the F-1 classrooms we have focused on counting songs and small group rotations to practice counting collections to 20 and to extend counting beyond 20.

The 1/2 classrooms have focused on using concrete materials to count collections to 20. writing numbers, making collections, skip counting and counting from different numbers.
