#### Head Lice

As the weather continues to be warm, head lice can become very active. We have had several cases of lice at the school over the last week. As per the Victorian government instructions we ask all families to check the hair of each student. If your child has head lice they must be sent home and be treated. You must put the treatment through their hair and comb out any nits and eggs. Students may return to school once treated as long as there are no live nits left remaining. Students will be sent home again if live nits are still present.

Learning Conversations - Wednesday 13 March

Our first Learning Conversations this year will be held next week on Wednesday 13th of March. We ask all families to book a learning conversation with each of their children's teachers. Bookings can be made via the PAM App, with the office or with your child's teacher which will open up shortly. This year our conversations are going to happen on the one day and our school day will end 1 hour earlier at 2:15 pm on Wednesday 13 March. If students aren't able to be picked up, we will have areas across the school where they can be supervised until the normal finish time of 3:15 pm.

Reminder about Smart watches and Phones

Students at St Peter's are NOT to have either phones or smart watches with them at school. If your child has a phone or smart watch - they are asked to leave it at home or place it in the office for the duration of the school day. The item will be handed back at the end of each day. Devices will be taken from students if they are seen at school and returned at the end of the school day.

# Something to Think About

The glory of God here is Jesus fully alive to the exploitation of the poor, the mistreatment of the house of God, and fully alive to the faith that was beginning to grow in his disciples. How can I help those who suffer and endangered to the commitment of justice and faith??

# **The Story**

Jesus signed his death warrant when he cast commerce out of the temple. He stood up for the truth about God and about religion and the poor, as the business people of the temple were exploiting the poor with high prices. Lent gives us new insights into how Jesus lived his life, always within the shadow of his death. Even this scene at the start of the gospel has us remembering that this would lead him to death and to glory.

# The Scriptures ~ John 2:13-25

But it was almost time for the Jewish Passover Feast. So Jesus went to Jerusalem. In the Temple he found men selling cattle, sheep, and doves. He saw others sitting at tables, exchanging money. Jesus made a whip out of cords. Then he forced all these men, with the sheep and cattle, to leave the Temple. He turned over the tables and scattered the money of the men who were exchanging it. Then he said to those who were selling pigeons, "Take these things out of here! Don't make my Father's house a place for buying and selling!"

When this happened the followers remembered what was written in the Scriptures: "My strong love for your Temple completely controls me." The Jews said to Jesus, "Show us a miracle for a sign. Prove that you have the right to do these things." Jesus answered, "Destroy this temple, and I will build it again in three days."

# Information for parents and carers

# Why do students do NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year.

NAPLAN is a test that checks how well students are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

It allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace the ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance and can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

# Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Online NAPLAN tests are designed to provide precise results and are engaging for students. The tests present questions that may be more or less difficult depending on the student's response. All Year 3 students will complete the writing assessment on paper.

Year 3 and 5 students will have the opportunity to complete the following tests;

Writing

Reading

Conventions of language (grammar, punctuation & spelling) and

Numeracy

# Participation in NAPLAN

Adjustments are available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs and should reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments.
