

Marshall - 'Asking for help can help you solve any issue'




Tricky Words

The Story

The baptism of Jesus immerses him in the life of the people. He joined the queue of people for John's baptism, wanting to share the joys and sorrows of his people. In the depths of the water he entered into the depths of his own humanity and the depths of his people. We could say that Jesus has entered into that part of all of us which laughs and sings, dances and cries, feels for the sick and the suffering, desires the best for self and others; nothing human is foreign to him as he was baptised into the life of his people and the God of his ancestors.

The Scriptures ~ Mark 1:1-11

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this: 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.' " They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said, and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it, and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

This session will focus on learning to name feelings and practice some ideas to handle feelings.
- **Friday, April 5: Social fun** - Rachel and Tash
This session will be all about friendships, what makes a good friend, how to communicate with and respect others.
- **Tuesday, April 9: Magnificent me** - Natalia and Tash
This workshop is about naming your strengths and learning to praise yourself. Open to siblings of children with ASD. Great skills for both parents and children.
- **Thursday, April 11: Kids and Worry** - Daniel and Julia/Lisa
This workshop will give parents and children a better understanding of worry and how to deal with it.
