Good Afternoon,

Leadership News

Mr Paul Desmond - the Director of Catholic Education Sandhurst - made an announcement here at school on Monday. Mr Desmond explained that from 2018 we would be trialling a different Leadership structure here at St Peter's. Instead of having a Principal and Deputy Principal, for the next few years, we would have two Co-Principals. I am thrilled to announce that our Co-Principal is Mr Michael Chalkley. Michael and I will be working together very closely and we are very confident that this arrangement will be a huge benefit to St Peter's. Many of you will know Michael through his teaching and leadership at CCB, however, he will be attending tonight's session with Dan Petro for anyone who would like to meet him. We will have a more formal introduction to the school community later in the year.

Important announcement regarding After School Care

It has come to my attention and to Extend's attention that some parents in the school community believe After School Care is closing at the end of this term. This is NOT the case.

After School Care is provided by Extend who have an ongoing contract with our school.

Due to the small number of daily attendances at our After School Care service, this service must be underwritten by the school. As the service is a significant financial investment for the school, Extend offered for the school to seek other options that may be cheaper for us. At no time did Extend say they would close the service. They simply offered for us to find a more cost effective alternative if one was available. On investigating other alternatives, we realised there is no company or options that will be better value for money than Extend. This has been communicated with Extend and they are very pleased to continue to provide this service. Again, at no point has Extend ever threatened to close this service.

To keep this service open long term we need is the community's support. If we can get to above 10 bookings per day our service will continue indefinitely. However, at the current level of 5-6 bookings per day this service is a significant investment for the school and we may not be able to continue with the service due to that cost. We will continue to monitor the daily bookings. However, we can assure you, for the benefit of our families, the school will continue to invest in this service until at least the end of 2017 to give more families time to use the service so it can reach higher daily bookings.

I ask that all families avoid engaging in unfounded discussions based on rumour. Should you have any questions about After School Care, please make an appointment to see me.

As you are aware, earlier this term we had Mr Michael Lawlor join our staff enabling Mr Miggy Podosky to take up a Behaviour Support Role. Sadly, Mr Lawlor was unable to continue in the position and Mr P has returned to the classroom. Due to the urgency of the Behaviour Support Role I have asked Miggy to come out of the classroom for the duration of Term 4. We have Mrs Laura Graco replacing Miggy for the Term. Miggy and Laura will work closely together to ensure a smooth transition for the students. I appreciate that this is another change for this group of students, however, I ask for your continued understanding while we put some specific, targeted interventions and supports in place across the school, to assist with the behaviour changes we are trying to teach and implement.

While we are very sad to be losing some incredible teachers next year - we are also very excited to be welcoming a few new people to our staff.

We will have three new teachers joining us in 2018. Two of those we know about already. I assure you we are very fortunate to have Ms Marcia Seymour and Mr Cameron Turnbull joining our team. Just collect your stickers, stick them on the sticker sheet and then drop the sheet into the collection box at school.






SCHOOL NURSING PROGRAM - PREP SCREENING

HOW TO HELP CHILDREN DEVELOP A LOVE FOR READING?

Assisting your child to develop a love for reading in your child's early years is a lifelong gift on so many levels and it is not hard to do. Reading and being read to develops the imagination it is a pleasurable experience to share with those we love, but it also, importantly, leads them on a natural path in the development of important literacy skills. Reading provides a skill required for the growth of knowledge and critical thinking and problem solving skills, it can also become pleasurable past time and hobby whilst also an escape from our busy lives. Developing a love for books in the early years will set your child up for reading readiness and help lay the foundations for your child's success in their future years beyond the school gate.



What can you do at home?

- Encourage your child to read everyday.
- Read with your child.
- Ask them about what they are reading in class.
- Have them read all types of text such as biographies, newspapers, advertisements, posters, poetry, plays, magazines, etc.





A colouring competition for the field days is attached to this newsletter. If you would like the school to post your entry, make sure it is returned by Thursday 20th September. See the school office for extra copies.




Future walk, ride and scoot to school path? Have your say...



The People's Pantry is a new food initiative for people with a Health Care Card and/or Pension Card.

We are trialling the idea from October – December 2017, and we need 20 households to test it out with us.

How does it work?

The People's Pantry is a membership model. Once you join, you can collect food once a week.

Members pay a small amount per term (\$10), and help out once every month.
