# CATHOLIC IDENTITY

## This week's readings

### **Mark 10:46-52**

Jesus and his disciples went to Jericho. And as they were leaving they were followed by a large crowd. A blind beggar by the name of Bartimaeus son of Timaeus was sitting beside the road. When he heard that it was Jesus from Nazareth, he shouted "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!" Many people told the man to stop, but he shouted even louder, "Son of David, have pity on me!" Jesus stopped and said, "Call him over!" They called out to the blind man and said, "Don't be afraid! Come on! He is calling for you." The man threw off his coat as he jumped up and ran to Jesus. Jesus asked, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man answered, "Master, I want to see!" Jesus told him, "You may go. Your eyes are healed because of your faith."

Right away the man could see, and he went down the road with Jesus.

### **Reflection**

*"...and he went down the road with Jesus."*

This Gospel highlights to us the transformative power of faith. In this short passage, we see Bartimaeus transform from an outcast, told to be quiet by those around him, to someone who was able to be a part of the community, travelling along with Jesus. This was all possible because of his faith. In spite of the difficulties he faced, he had the strength of faith to trust that through Jesus he could be healed. This week let us notice the blessings we receive from God, help us to let these moments transform our lives and hearts so we can go "down the road with Jesus."

### Why do we need Bees?

"Anyone who cares about the health of the planet, for now and for generations to come, needs to answer this wake-up call. ...Fewer bees lead to lower availability and potentially higher prices of fruit and vegetables. Fewer bees mean no almonds, less coffee and less alfalfa hay available to feed dairy cows. ...We need good, clean food, and so do our pollinators. If bees do not have enough to eat, we won't have enough to eat. Dying bees scream a message to us that they cannot survive in our current agricultural and urban environments..."

The Long Gully People's Pantry helps healthcare card holders source groceries, fruit and vegetables.


**Membership of the Pantry cost \$10 a term.**


