

This week's readings

Mark 13:24-32

Jesus said to his disciples:

In those days, right after that time of suffering, The sun will become dark, and the moon will no longer shine. The stars will fall and the powers in the sky will be shaken. Then the Son of Man will be seen coming in the clouds with great power and glory. He will send his angels to gather his chosen ones from all over the earth.

Learn a lesson from a fig tree. When its branches spout and start putting out leaves, you know summer is near. So when you see all these things happening, you will know that the time has almost come. You can be sure that some of the people living today will still be alive when all this happens. The sky and the earth will not last forever, but my words will.

No one knows the day or the time. The angels in heaven don't know, and the Son himself doesn't know. Only the Father knows.

Reflection

This week's Gospel reminds us that nothing on Earth is forever. Knowing this helps us keep things in perspective, helps us to remember what really matters. Our Catholic faith teaches us not to fear this, but to live a life true to the

two most important commandments – Love God and love your neighbour.

With these two commandments and our faith in our salvation through Christ, we know that this world is not the end for us, we have hope in life eternal.

What are planned burns?

Planned burns are the safe, supervised burning of fuel loads such as shrubs, bark and leaf litter to effectively reduce the risk of bushfires.



TIP: How can YOU reduce fuel loads around your home?

Experts recommend you slash, mow and compost any shrubs, bark and leaf litter around your home and clean your spouts regularly.
