



**Praying with the Joyful Mysteries:** Jesuit Communications offers a series of reflections around the five Joyful Mysteries. **This week, we explore the Visitation.**



**Gospel reading: Luke 1:39-45**

### Reflection

In the second Joyful Mystery we consider a remarkable event: a pregnant Mary's visit to a pregnant Elizabeth (Luke 1:39-45). Travelling a long distance, Mary wishes to be present with her cousin. When Mary 'greet's Elizabeth she brings the saving consolation of her son Jesus. Then when 'the child leaped in her womb' John recognises his Lord for the first time. Elizabeth exclaims 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.' As they share their experience of fulfillment, they become the first followers of Christ – the founding members of the Christian community.

- 1 Having heard Elizabeth's good news from afar, Mary ventures a long distance to visit her cousin. When is the last time you shared good news with a relative or friend? What did you share?
- 2 On seeing Mary, Elizabeth feels John leap for joy within her womb. Can you remember an experience where all that was within you leapt for joy?
- 3 Mary is blessed among women for she carries Jesus. Can you imagine carrying Jesus within you this Advent?
- 4 Mary's visit is an extraordinary blessing for Elizabeth. Can you remember a time you experienced a powerfully uplifting visit from a friend?
- 5 Mary and Elizabeth form an early Christian community even before their children are born. Who do you seek to build community with?
