### Good afternoon families,

#### Welcome to Term 3!

We hope everyone enjoyed some time relaxing and resting over the holidays and all are ready for the next part of this interesting year. At this stage we are staying with the same restrictions as we had in Term 2 - and hopefully - we won't have to return to remote learning like they have in Melbourne and the Mitchell Shire.

Please look after all people who are sick and scared in our country. Help them to remember that you are there for them all in their times of worry and fear.


Bless all those who are working to help the sick - keep them safe and full of compassion.

#### Something to Think About

Do you know the difference between hearing and listening? Sometimes we might hear somebody talking to us, but we are not really listening.

Maybe we are distracted, or maybe our hearts are not open to hearing or responding to what the other person is saying. It is just like this when we hear the message of Jesus too.

Is your heart open to hearing the word of God today?

#### The Story

Today's gospel is a parable about the Kingdom. The 'Kingdom' is a key theme throughout Matthew's gospel. Jesus told stories using images and objects that were familiar to the people - in this case it was the planting of seeds. The seeds represent Jesus' message and the soil represents how different people respond to or listen to Jesus' message.

#### The Scriptures

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 13:3-

Then Jesus taught them many things by using stories. He said: "A farmer went out to scatter seed in a field. While the farmer was scattering the seed, some of it fell along the road and was eaten by birds. Other seeds fell on thin, rocky ground and quickly started growing because the soil was not very deep. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched and dried up, because they did not have enough roots.

Some other seeds fell where thorn bushes grew up and choked the plants.

But a few seeds did fall on good ground where the plants produced a hundred or sixty or thirty times as much as was scattered. If you have ears, pay attention!"

## **HIGHLIGHTS**





#### Dear After The Bell Aus St Peters OSHC Parents / Guardians,

Each year, After The Bell Aus reviews the cost of care and policies and procedures to our OSHC families. Through the fee and policy review process, consideration is given to maintaining quality services and addressing financial and Legislative responsibilities that the Child Care industry must uphold and are faced with.

The education and Child Care sector incurs one of the highest CPI increases every year between 3.5% - 8%. Though due to Covid-19 pandemic the CPI increases is not so high this upcoming financial year. After The Bell Aus increase is reflective of the CPI increase by 5.205625% which covers the increases across the board (Insurance, consumables, utilities etc.)

After The Bell Aus recognises that affordability for families is important especially through current times with the pandemic, as is service viability and keeping inline of sector annual CPI and Legislative requirements. All annual fee increase work towards maintaining a cost- neutrality and ensuring all running cost are maintained. The decision to increase the fees is never taken lightly but is necessary to meet the increased operation costs, being in line with CPI, Government, Legislative and business operational costs.

After The Bell Aus remains one of the lowest cost programs, transparent booking and cancellation procedures and no hidden charges. Further to this, with our policy reviews we take on board all feedback provided and with feedback provided, we have made some changes indicated in the below table.
