
Something to Think About

In these times of fake news and alternative facts, it is so refreshing to hear Jesus solemnly proclaim that he was born and came into the world to testify to the truth. The basic truth is that God is love and loves the world he created so much that he sent his own Son to save it. I ask myself how important truth is for me, and to what extent am I committed to finding it and living by it.

I ask for the grace to seek and listen to his voice.

The Story

'My kingdom is not from this world'. From the rest of Jesus' words and especially from his actions it is obvious that he does not mean that his kingdom is totally other-worldly, having nothing to do with matters of this world. He means that it is not built on power-seeking at all costs and on violence, like most 'kingdoms' of this world, but on other values, mostly on love, mercy and universal solidarity. I consider how much my faith in Jesus influences my decisions in the concrete world.



The Scriptures

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to John 18:33-37

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not from this world. World Fisheries day

World Fisheries Day is celebrated on November 21st every year, around the whole world.

WHAT IS IT?

World Fisheries Day

is a day to remind us of how much human lives need water and the lives it sustains (in and out of the water). Water is essential to our survival, whether contained in rivers, lakes, and oceans; Fishing feeds people all around the world (especially those living near water); Fishing provides many jobs for people all over the world; Water is a means of transportation; and Water is an important source of fish, aquatic protein and clean air for

WHY IS WORLD FISHERIES DAY IMPORTANT?

World Fisheries Day is important because a recent United Nations study found that most of the world's fisheries are overfished or fully harvested and others are suffering due to fish habitat loss, pollution, and global warming. Severe ocean and coastal pollution from human activities has also led to depletion of fish stocks in traditional grounds along with the unsustainable fishing methods being used. "The World Fisheries Day helps to highlight these problems, and moves towards finding solutions to the increasingly interconnected problems we are facing, and in the longer term, to sustainable means of maintaining fish stocks."

DID YOU KNOW?

- Small-scale fisheries (marine and inland) employ about 90% of those involved in fisheries.
- 65% of the reported catch from inland fisheries is from low-income food-deficit countries.
- It is believed that around 30-60 million people in the developing world are involved in inland fisheries; it is thought that about 50% are women.
- More than 25% of the world's dietary protein is provided by fish.
 The human population consumes over 100 million tons of fish annually.
- Over 200 million of Africa's 1 billion people regularly consume fish and nearly half of this comes from inland fisheries.

WHAT CAN WE DO TO HELP CELEBRATE WORLD FISHERIES DAY?

World Fisheries day is celebrated by communities around the world through rallies, workshops, cultural programs,

meetings, exhibitions, shows and demonstrations. You can find out more about these celebrations and learn more about the importance of fisheries at GDRC. org. Sharing knowledge about every important environmental issue is just as important as caring for the environment through our actions.

Fresh Food Project


