
Good afternoon families,

Covid Vaccination Hub

BDAC have offered St Peter's the opportunity to be a vaccination hub for children from 5 years old to 12 years old to receive the Covid Vaccination. The first day will be Friday the 11th of March. Appointment times will be provided once the paperwork is completed. There is no obligation to have your child vaccinated at school, but of course we encourage all who have not yet had their children vaccinated to do so.

Something to Think About

Jesus knows me better than I know myself: he loves me as I am. But he also works, often through others, to help me become aware of the ways I can spoil things. He wants to make me more compassionate and easier to get along with.

I ask him, in the words of the liturgy,

to help me grow in love.

The Story

Jesus' experience teaches us that there is nothing wrong with being tempted. It's how we react to the temptation that matters. A short prayer or a quote from God's Word will help us let it go. For example: 'Lead me not into temptation' or 'I must forgive, not once but seventy times.'

The Scriptures Luke 4:1-13

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone." Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." WHY DO WE HAVE SEAWEEK?

These two awareness weeks occur from the 5th of March until the 13th March. The SeaWeek theme for 2022 is "Our SEArch - what will you discover?" drawn from the fact that our oceans are largely unexplored. Its focus is on drawing the community's attention to the world's seas, providing information and encouraging an appreciation of the sea and marine environments.

WHY IS THE SEA IMPORTANT?

Australia is a marine nation surrounded by seas/oceans and relying on them in different ways. We have one of the largest ocean territories in the world, and it drives our climate and weather, generates employment, provides food and resources, and offers lifestyle and recreational opportunities (source CSIRO). Our ocean covers 70% of the planet and supports life as we know it. Every second breath we take comes from the ocean, it feeds billions of people and hosts 80% of the world's biodiversity.







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CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (31 January 2022) or term two (26 April 2022).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
 - If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2022 closes on the 24 June 2022.

School Visits - Dental Van

Dear Parent / Guardian,



We will be visiting St Peter's Primary School on Monday 21st March 2022. Please return forms to school office by Monday 14th March.

The Martin Vale Dentistry's mobile van will be conducting dental visits to your school/preschool/kinder. Treatment may be BULK BILLED through Medicare Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS) for eligible students. Students that are not eligible for CDBS funding have the option to receive treatment as a private patient.

The following explains the steps involved.



Our First Visit

Students Eligible for CDBS receive an examination, X-rays, fluoride & fissure sealants

Parents contacted by phone soon after to discuss a treatment plan using the available CDBS funding.

Students not eligible receive dental screening

Parents contacted by phone soon after to discuss if a private appointment is recommended.

Follow up visit

We will schedule a date to return to your school/preschool/kinder to go ahead with the treatment plan we have discussed with you and gained your consent for.

Parents are welcome to attend the dental van while their child has their treatment. 3

Choose your location

a) Our dental van is fully quipped to do fillings, fissure sealants, scaling and cleaning, extractions and fluoride application.

 b) If you prefer, you also have to option to have your child's treatment done at our private practice at 116 Queen Street, Bendigo.
