

Something to Think About

The 'good thief' saw things as they were: he knew his own sinfulness; he recognized Jesus' character; he asked for little yet was rewarded for his honesty. Humility brings a true perspective and is the ground for meeting God. I pray for humility.

The Scriptures Luke 23:35-43

And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at Jesus, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews." One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

The Story

Salvation begins its work here and now: the second criminal recognizes him as a just man, and humbly asks for his help. He hears the promise of eternal joy from Jesus' lips. When I am suffering, I can turn to Jesus and hear the same words. 'Today' means 'in God's good time.'

There is no school this Friday however we are still able to provide food boxes. Pick up from school between 2pm - 3.15pm. Please call the wellbeing team if you have questions.



WHEN IS WORLD FISHERIES DAY?

World Fisheries Day is celebrated on November 21st every year, around the whole world.

WHAT IS IT?

World Fisheries Day reminds us of how much human lives need water and the lives it sustains (in and out of the water). All around the world water is essential to our survival, whether in rivers, lakes, and oceans; fishing feeds people (especially those living near water); fishing provides many jobs for people; water is a means of transportation; and water is an important source of fish, aquatic protein and clean air.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

World Fisheries Day is important because many of the world's fisheries are overfished or fully harvested, and others are suffering due to fish habitat loss, pollution, and global warming. Severe pollution from human activities and unsustainable fishing methods have led to depletion of fish stocks in traditional grounds. It is working towards solutions to these problems.


DID YOU KNOW?
